



2018 Grantees

In our first round of funding, the St. Louis City Senior Fund issued grants to 17 organizations in July 2018 to provide programs and services for residents living in the City of St. Louis who are 60 years and older. Grants were allocated in two primary focus areas, fall prevention and economic stability.

Fall Prevention Grants

For many older adults, an unexpected fall can result in a serious and costly injury. [Missouri's rate](#) of injury by falling is 31% higher than the national average. These grants aim to reduce fall risk and prevent falls by supporting home assessments, home modifications and repairs, and exercise and education programs. Our goal is to help older adults live safely in the home that best serves their needs.

Jewish Family & Children Services

Jewish Family and Children's Service provides a comprehensive social work assessment for older adults, along with case management, in order to identify and access community resources needed to mitigate fall risk. Economic Stability Grants

Many older adults struggle to meet their monthly expenses, even if they are not considered “poor” because they have income above the Federal Poverty Line. These grants aim to increase monthly income for older adults by connecting them to federal, state, local, and private benefits they may not be aware of or reducing monthly expenses by providing home weatherization and utility assistance, as well as assistance with moving to more affordable housing.
